The Mechanics of an Equity Long-Short Fund

Seeking to benefit from both high-conviction longs and low-conviction shorts

How Long-Short Investing Works?

A long-short strategy aims to generate returns by simultaneously buying high-conviction stocks (Long positions) and selling low-conviction/overvalued stocks (Short Positions).

Long Position (Buy)

Buy an asset with the expectation that **price will rise**.

Profit when the **price increases**.

Example: Buy at ₹40 → Sell at ₹100
→ Gain ₹60

Long = Bullish (Expecting prices to rise)



Short Position (Sell)

Sell an asset with the expectation that **price will fall**.

Profit when the **price declines**.

Example: Short at ₹200 → Buy back at ₹150 → Gain ₹50

Short = Bearish (Expecting prices to fall)

Long-Only vs Long-Short: Beyond Directional Investing

Long-Short Strategies expand the opportunity set by capturing both rising and falling stock trends

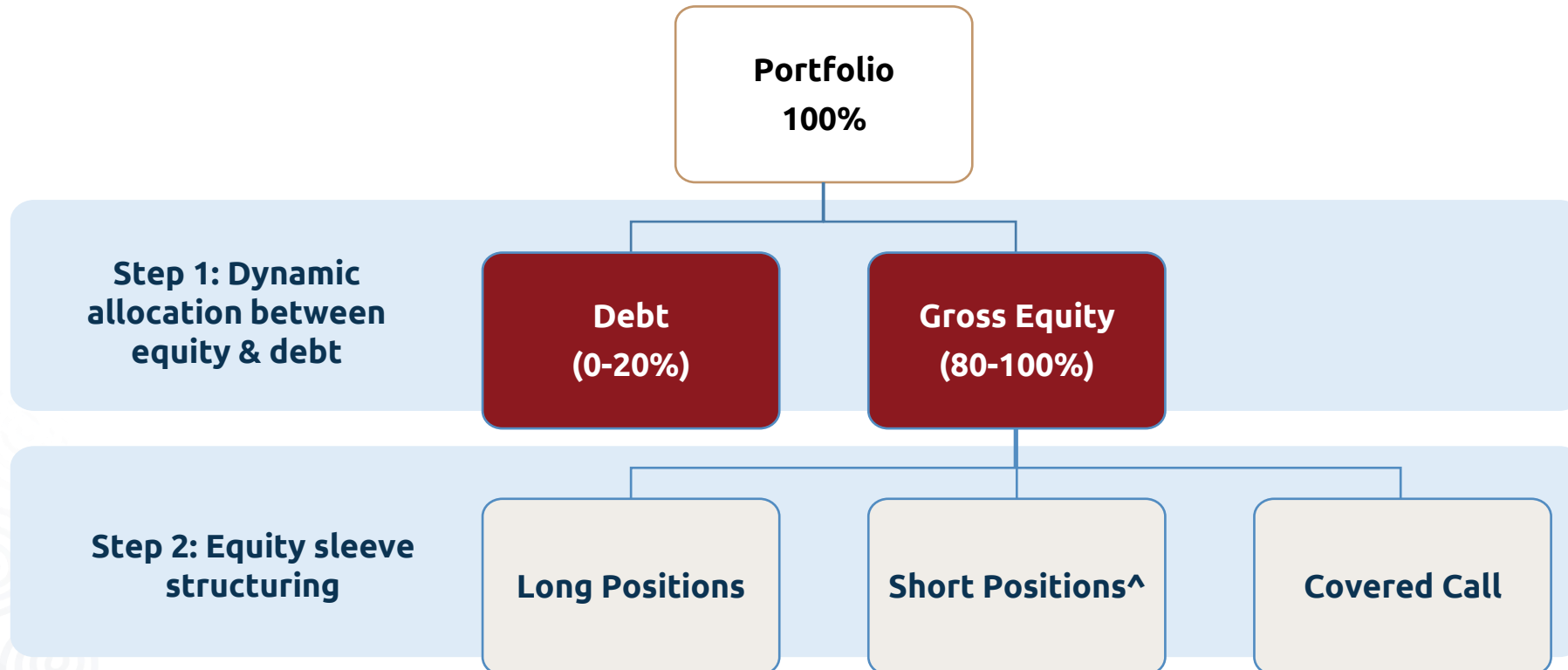

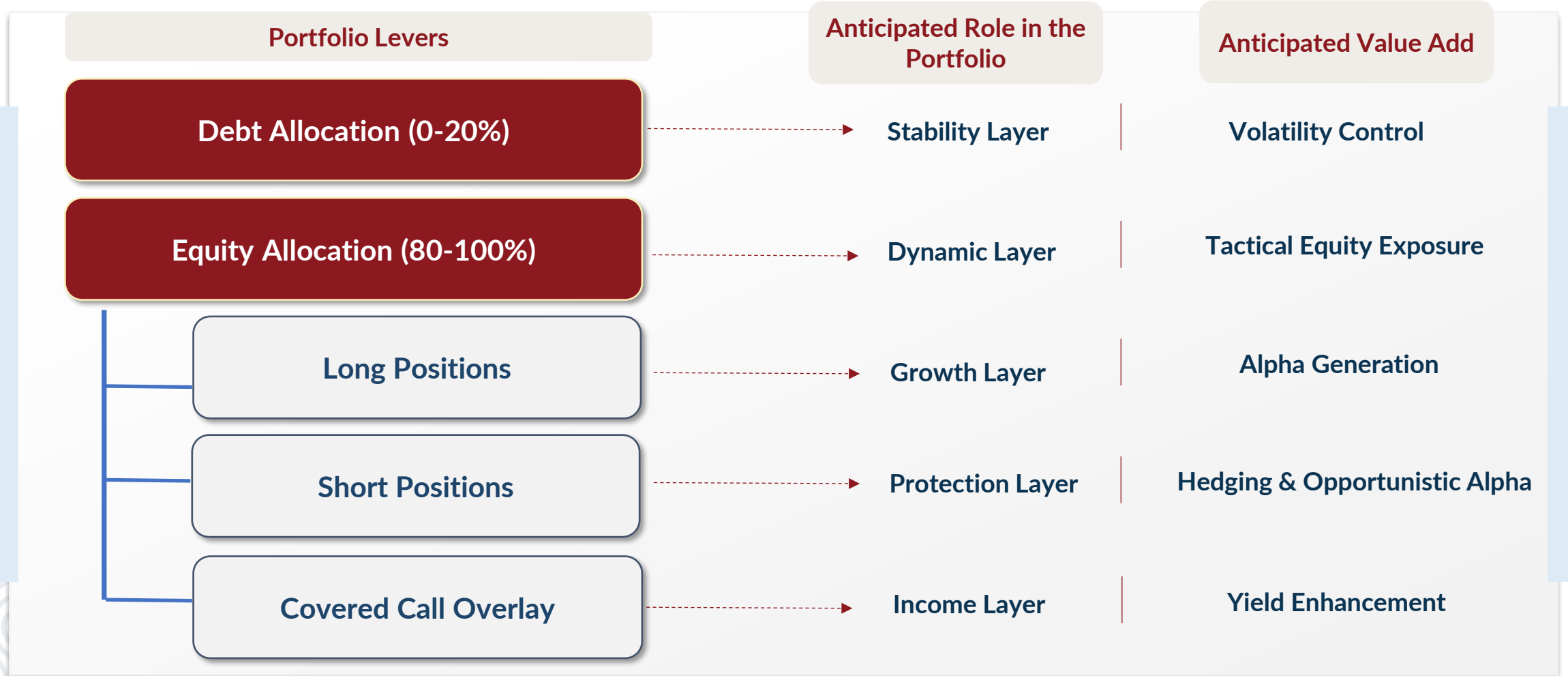

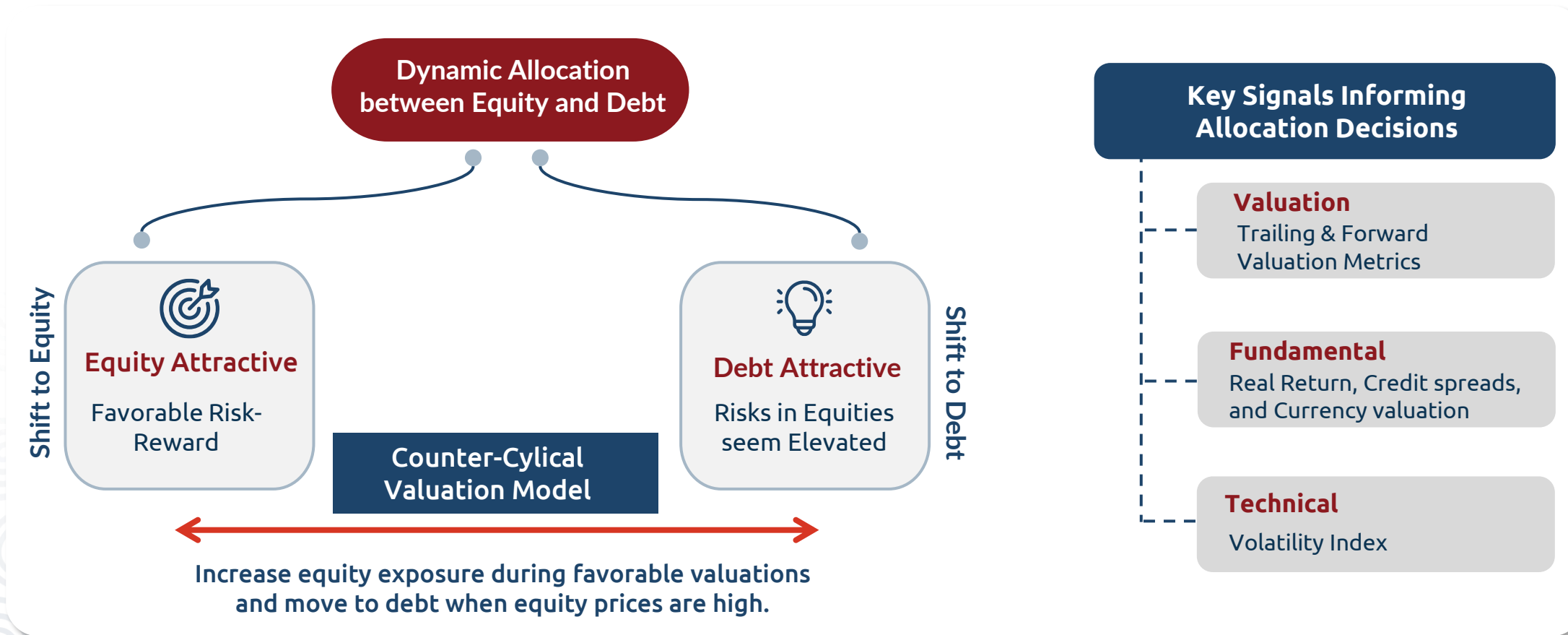

Core Stock Selection

01 Universe

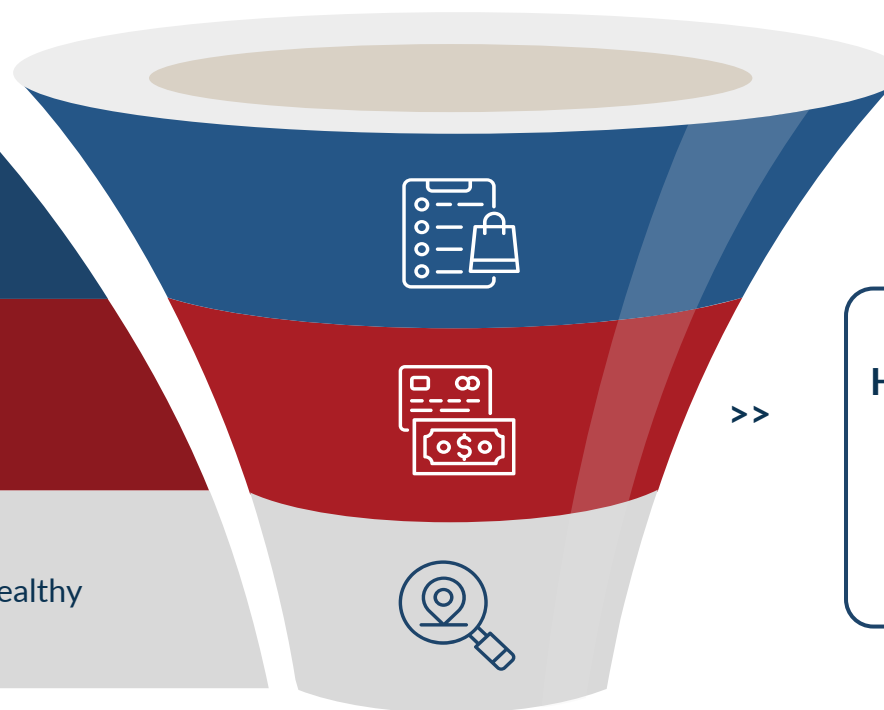
Stocks within the AMC's analyst coverage universe (~650 stocks^{\$}).

02 Filtering out Lower-Quality Stocks

Excludes companies with low ROCE, high leverage, elevated volatility, and high expectation risk.

03 Focus on Stocks with Visible Growth

Focus on companies with predictable growth and healthy cash generation.



High-Conviction Focused Long portfolio

A focused portfolio of 30–40 stocks, prioritizing low earnings risk and valuation discipline.

Equity Short: Selective and Opportunistic Usage



Indian equities currently reflect elevated earnings expectations, with actual EPS growth trailing consensus by 9.9%*, among the widest gaps globally. The short strategy aims to capitalize on this tailwind.

The short strategy targets richly valued companies where earnings expectations appear elevated.

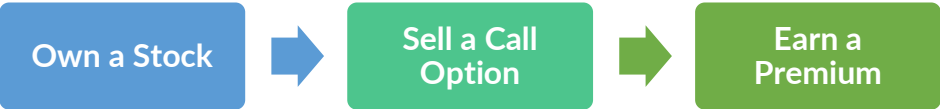

Equity Covered Calls: Income Through Selective Option Writing

A covered call strategy involves holding a long equity position while selling a call option on the same stock to earn a premium. This aims to generate incremental income while retaining ownership of the underlying equity.

Why Covered Calls Add Value

- ▶ **Income Enhancement:** Seeks to convert equity holdings into yield-generating assets.
- ▶ **Risk Moderation:** Premium incomes partially cushion the downside.
- ▶ **Hold at Fair Value:** Retains exposure to high-quality stocks while potentially earning incremental income.

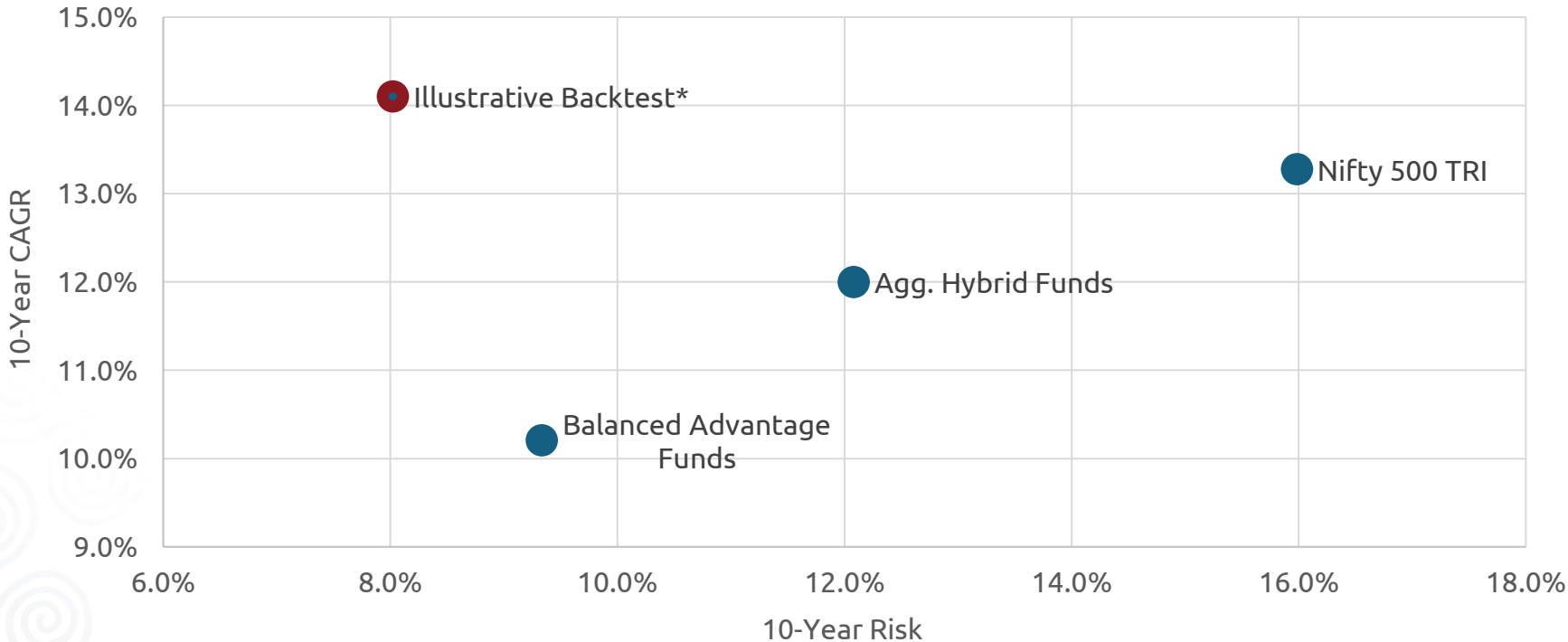

Rolling Returns Performance

On a rolling return basis, the backtest has consistently outperformed by 2–4% versus comparable hybrid indices and around 1% versus the broad equity index.

Limitation of the strategy

Bear Period: The period beginning at a peak from which the Nifty 500 TRI declines by more than 10%, and ending at the point where the drawdown reaches its maximum (the trough)

Bull Period: The period beginning at a peak, during which the Nifty 500 TRI rises by more than 10%, and ending at the highest peak formed before it starts declining.

Sideways: The period beginning at a peak, during which the Nifty 500 TRI neither falls by more than 10% nor rises by more than 10%.

Recovery: The time from the bear trough to when the Nifty 500 TRI regains its previous peak.

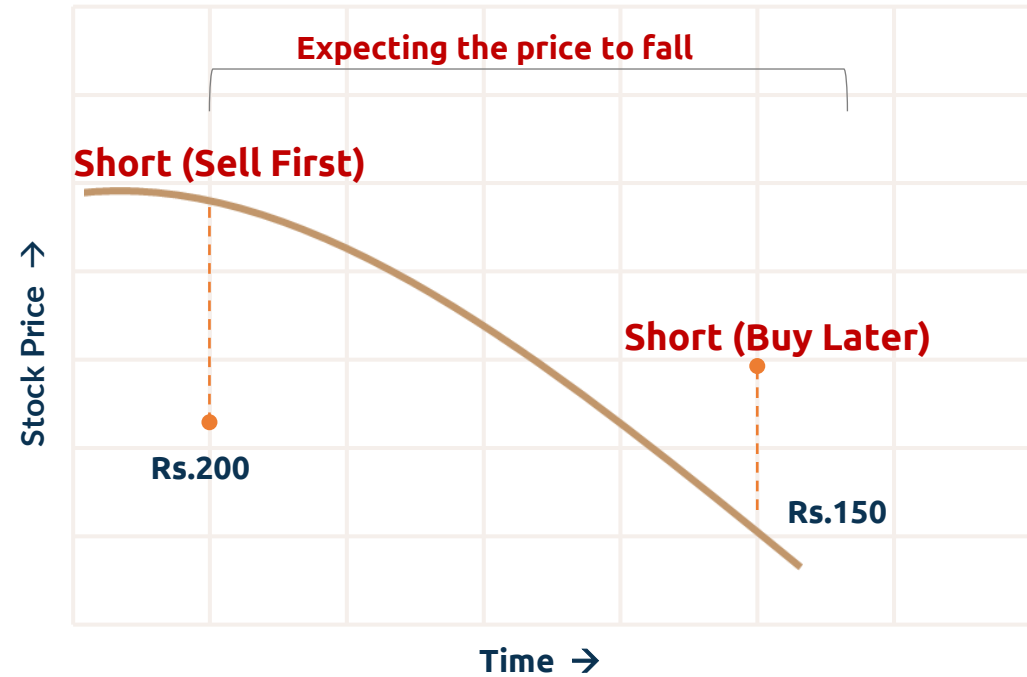

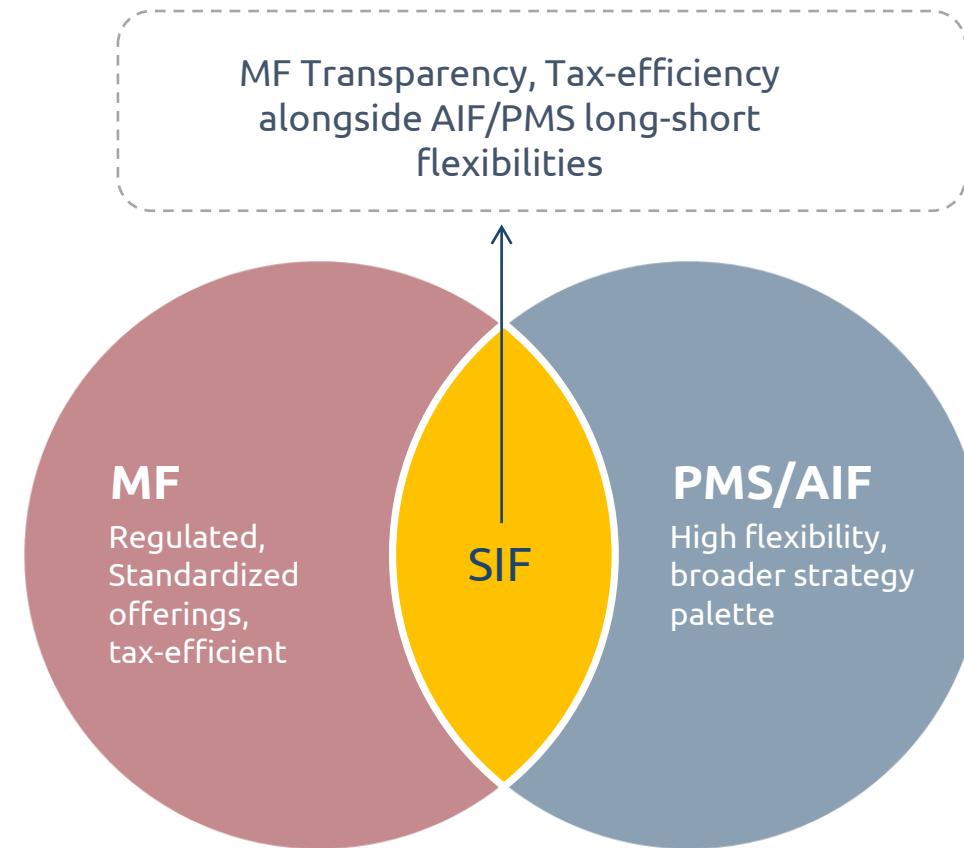

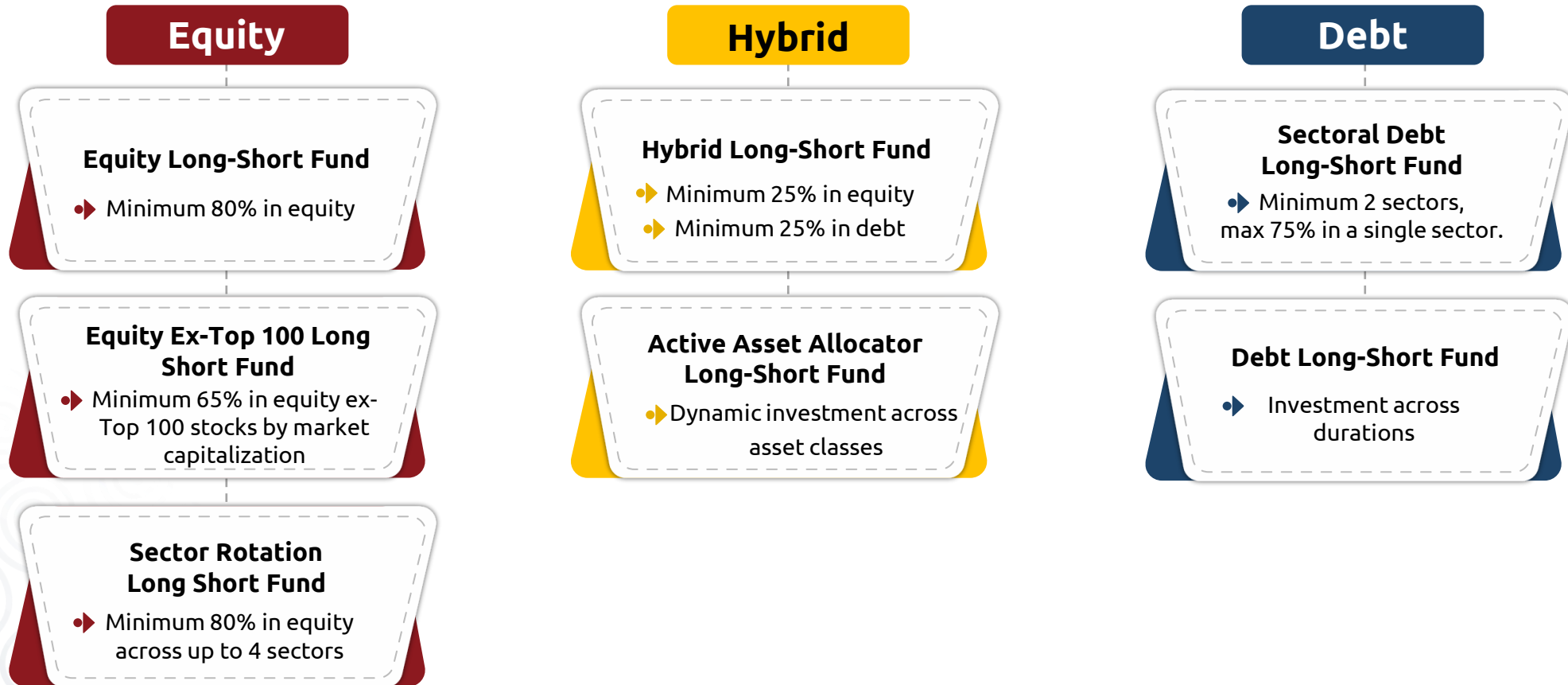
Specialized Investment Funds: Sweet Spot between MFs and PMS/AIF

The Specialized Investment Fund (SIF) is a **new investment product** introduced by SEBI to **bridge the gap** between Mutual Funds and Portfolio Management Services / Alternative Investment Funds, offering **advanced investment strategies** tailored for sophisticated investors.

SIFs combine the flexibility of long-short approaches seen in PMS/AIF with the governance, transparency, and tax efficiency associated with mutual funds.



Seven Structured Strategies Permitted under the SIF Platform



Only one strategy is permitted to be launched under each sub-category.
